For all of our returning educators, the last paycheck for last school year (2022-23) is Aug 31. Our first paycheck for the new school year (2023-24) is Sep 15. The Sep 15 pay will include our negotiated increases. All returning educators will receive a 2.5% increase. Many returning educators will receive a step increase or an educational step increase. These increases will also begin on Sep 15. We will receive workshop, new teacher camp, and summer special ed pay on Sep 29.

- Being asked to have a meeting with an Administrator, you always can ask a rep. to attend.
- Helping to navigate differences with colleagues instead of going to Administration.
- Classroom and building cleanliness and safety.
- Anything that makes you question, "Is this okay? Does this apply to the contract language?"
- O What are office hours?
- What are my responsibilities for Open House, Conferences, and Engagement Night?
