Weingarten Rights: The rights of employees covered by the NLRA to request union representation during investigatory interviews if they reasonably believe that the interview could result in their being disciplined. Weingarten rights also guarantee the rights of union representatives to assist and counsel employees during interviews which could lead to discipline.


## Professional Development by Darlene Puljic, ETA Secretary

Save your certificates! As per our contract, you can earn extra pay for completing up to 25 hours of professional development training. Compensation can be turned in in increments of 5 hours. These trainings must be completed beyond your work day. The trainings must be completed from June 2023 through May 2024. You should keep a record of your trainings (certificates) in a file and be ready to turn them in by the May deadline. Also, for this year, PSW training will be worth 6 hours of PD for the time that was spent on the courses.

All pd hour submissions must be approved by your principal. If you have questions about this part of your contract, contact an ETA officer or rep in your building.

## 8.3 Professional Development Training Compensation

Teachers shall have the opportunity to attend professional development training in return for compensation. For each five (5) hours attended up to a maximum of twenty-five (25) hours per year, the teacher shall be paid at the rate set out in 2.1.3, i.e., .0050 of the BA base salary. Teachers who qualify for such compensation shall be paid with the final check in June. The EPDC will review the Request for Professional Development Training form at the request of the Superintendent's designee or the ETA President (see Appendix F).

## **Focused Observations Contract Language 3.5.3**

At the first post-conference, based on the first semester formal holistic observation, one or two focus area(s) for the second formal observation will be determined. A focus area is defined as one component on the Rubric.

That being said, when the evaluator comes in they will look for how you are doing in the identified focus areas but he/she will also observe the lesson in its entirety and may add evidence in categories other than the focus area.

Per Contract Language 3.5.1, You and the evaluator may mutually agree to waive the pre-conference questions. However, if there were any areas on the rubric that you were developing, make sure that in the pre-conference you either have written answers or can articulate what is needed to get skilled in that area. In addition, you should be prepared to discuss and/or show how you worked on the focus area(s) between the last observation and this observation.

Similar to the first round, **you still need to have a lesson plan** and should be prepared to discuss how you are using/have used HQSD in your classroom instruction so far this year.
