**Tamara Reik** On Sunday, January 26, 2025, elementary and middle school orchestra teacher Tamara Reik had the unique opportunity to perform on the prestigious stage of Severance Hall, home to the renowned Cleveland Orchestra. Tamara is an accomplished violinist who performs with the Parma Symphony Orchestra, a community ensemble consisting of 100 musicians from diverse backgrounds across Northeast Ohio. The orchestra has been an integral part of the region's musical landscape since its founding in 1968.

During the month of January, while the Cleveland Orchestra embarks on its concert series in Florida, Severance Hall opens its doors to host community and school ensembles as part of the Northeast Ohio Band Invitational. This initiative provides local musicians with the extraordinary opportunity to perform in one of the world's most esteemed concert venues.

The Parma Symphony Orchestra is conducted by Dr. Rand Laycock, a retired music educator who dedicated 36 years to teaching in Parma. ## STRS Reemployment Account by Debbie Rudder, Retired Teacher

If you teach after you retire, STRS will open a reemployment account for you in addition to your recipient account (pension). When you apply to STRS for your reemployment retiree payment it will be paid in a lump sum directly to you OR rolled over to a qualified plan. If you are 65 or older you can have your reemployment retiree payment annuitized and added to your monthly pension payment, if it is over \$25 a month. Also, if you wait until you are 65 or older interest will be added to the money in your reemployment account, so you will get more money.

If you are not working at age 73 you **must** apply for your reemployment retiree payment because of the RMD (required minimum distribution) law. If you apply for your reemployment payment under age 59.5 you may have to pay an early withdrawal penalty.

"Upon your death, survivors will receive a lump-sum payment of any unpaid funds. It is important to keep your beneficiary information updated. Add beneficiaries to your reemployment account." (STRS website)
